The glorious resurrection of Jesus Christ:

A Reflection on Hope and New Life

The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is the cornerstone of our faith, the moment when life triumphed over death, and hope shattered the darkness of sin. When the stone was rolled away from the tomb, it was not merely an empty grave that was revealed—it was the dawn of a new creation, the fulfillment of God's promise, and the invitation to eternal life.


Victory Over Death

On that first Easter morning, the sorrow of Good Friday was transformed into uncontainable joy. The same Jesus who was mocked, beaten, and crucified now stood alive, radiant in His glorified body. Death, which once held humanity captive, was defeated. "O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?" (1 Corinthians 15:55). The empty tomb is proof that suffering and death do not have the final word—life does.

The Power of the Resurrection in Our Lives

The Resurrection is not just a historical event; it is a present reality that changes everything. Christ's rising from the dead assures us that no sin is too great, no darkness too deep, and no suffering too overwhelming for God's redeeming power. If we feel trapped in our weaknesses, anxieties, or burdens, the Risen Lord invites us to share in His victory. He calls us to step out of the tombs of our past and walk in the light of His grace.





Why Jesus washed the feet ?

Jesus washed the feet of His disciples as an act of humility, love, and service, teaching them a profound lesson on what it truly means to follow Him. This event, recorded in John 13:1-17, took place during the Last Supper, just before His Passion.

A Lesson in Humility:


In Jesus' time, washing feet was a task reserved for servants. By kneeling before His disciples and washing their feet, Jesus, the Master and Lord, demonstrated that true greatness comes through humble service. He told them:

"You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and rightly so, for that is what I am. Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet" (John 13:13-14).

A Foreshadowing of His Ultimate Sacrifice:

This humble act foreshadowed the greatest act of service Jesus would soon perform: His death on the Cross. Just as He stooped to wash their feet, He would humble Himself even further, taking on the sins of the world and giving His life for our salvation.

Alongside the spiritual sessions, the group bonded through a three-hour hike, games, and joyful moments of friendship.


We thank God for this blessed experience that renewed hearts and inspired the youth to walk with Christ.

Following prayer, the group discussed their agenda, focusing on upcoming activities and events within the church:


- March 19: Feast of St. Joseph Join us for Mass, followed by pastry preparations

Our MCF group had an exciting meeting at the church with 27 enthusiastic kids!


Together, they watched a captivating video about the life of Jesus Christ, focusing on His miracles, death, and resurrection.

Our parish was blessed with a powerful retreat led by Father Dominic Hanna (March 29-30).


He shared inspiring Gospel teachings, encouraging us to deepen and defend our faith and to confess our sins before Easter.


Dear Parishioners,





